**COMMISSIONERS COURT ACTION REQUESTED**

It is requested that the Commissioners Court approve an Interlocal Agreement (ILA) with the City of Haltom City to provide funding through the 2021 Transportation Bond Program (TBP), Countywide Initiatives and Partnerships (CWI), related to the Glenview Drive Construction (or Reconstruction) Project located in Precinct 4.

**BACKGROUND**

On September 5, 2023, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order #141673, approved a total of nine (9) projects for funding in the CWI funding category of the 2021 TBP. The Glenview Drive Construction (or Reconstruction) project is among the nine (9) CWI projects.

The County is now proceeding with the execution of the ILA with the City of Haltom City related to the Glenview Drive Construction (or Reconstruction) project. This project will be funded through the 2021 TBP, CWI category.

This Project will consist of the construction (or reconstruction) of Glenview Drive from US 377 to the east city limit, east of Waycrest Drive. This project is the reconstruction and widening of the existing four (4) lanes (2 lanes in each direction), variable width neighborhood connector with sidewalks. Other items of construction include storm drainage, water, and sanitary sewer replacement.

This ILA has been reviewed by the Auditor's Office and approved as to form by the Criminal District Attorney's Office.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

The fiscal impact to Tarrant County for the entire project will be \$4,146,000.00 in 2021 TBP-CWI funds to be distributed in accordance with Article V of the ILA. Funds are available in account 47800-2024 2021 Bond Election (Transportation)/6840100000 Transportation/579061 County Projects.
