6. The parties to this **Agreement** will not sell, assign, transfer or convey any benefits or obligations of this **Agreement** in whole or part without the prior written consent of both parties.

7. If any one or more of the provisions contained in this **Agreement**, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability will not affect any other provision of this **Agreement**.

8. This **Agreement** constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, and any and all prior negotiations are merged into this **Agreement**. Any amendment, change, or addition to this **Agreement** shall be made only in writing and signed by both parties.

9. This **Agreement** will be governed by and construed according to the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any action or claim arising from this **Agreement** will be in Tarrant County, Texas, as to state court actions, and the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas, as to federal court actions.

10. In providing the services required by this **Agreement**, **SOCIETY, INC.** must observe and comply with all applicable federal, state, and local statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations, including, without limitation, workers' compensation laws, minimum and maximum salary and wage statutes and regulations, and non-discrimination laws and regulations. **SOCIETY, INC.** shall be responsible for ensuring its compliance with any laws and regulations applicable to its business, including maintaining any necessary licenses and permits.

11. **SOCIETY, INC.** agrees to provide **COUNTY** all records relating to the programs performed by **SOCIETY, INC.** upon written request of **COUNTY** and to provide a final report detailing the manner in which such funds are expended and the program details of its services.

12. **SOCIETY, INC.** must submit to **COUNTY** a final report as to the program outcomes achieved within sixty (60) days of the end of the requested funding year [by November 30, 2024] by providing the following:

- (a) a program update on all outcomes accomplished and client populations served; and,
- (b) an accounting of all expenditures of **COUNTY** funds (salary, rent, training, etc.). *Any funds not used for the specified purposes or not used within the time limits specified in this contract are subject to be returned to **COUNTY**.*

Until receipt of this final report by **COUNTY**, all subsequent funding will be held in abeyance.

13. **SOCIETY, INC.** verifies that it does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of this contract. The term "boycott Israel" is as defined by Texas Government Code Section 808.001, effective September 1, 2017.





Executive Director's Report for January 2023

January 2023 – 79 individuals visited the Lenora Rolla Heritage Center Museum as of January 24th. The museum re-opened on July 1, 2021, but due to the global pandemic known as COVID-19 (and now the Delta, Omicron and more variants still being discovered), affecting almost every part of life on a global scale, and in response to the declarations from federal, state, and local officials, **the museum will accommodate tours/visitations Monday-Friday during normal hours of operation or by appointment. Masks are still encouraged for all visitors.**

January 4, 2023 – Film crew from the Dallas Mavericks visited the museum to film segment for Black History Month featuring Mrs. Rolla and the Lenora Rolla Heritage Center Museum. The segment will air during the play by play action during the Mavericks' basketball games. Received a follow-up email stating, **“Thank you for your time on Wednesday. We all were impressed with the museum and your tour. We hope the feature will live up to Ms. Rolla's legacy.”** We will be provided a link closer to the air date.

Amon Carter Museum referred local artist, Charles Gray to our museum. He and his photographer were given a tour conducted by Ms. Bennie Ruth Dickens, our loyal volunteer.

January 5, 2023 – Local artist, Charles Gray and his photographer Donnie Williams returned to the museum to videotape the oral history of both Sarah Walker and Ms. Bennie Ruth Dickens. Donnie Williams donated a book of his photography work to the museum.

January 6, 2023 – Tara Crosby and co-worker, Dana, represent a Diversity council at KPMG from KPMG LLP visited the museum and would like to collaborate with us during Black History Month. February 10th is the tentative date set for us to address their employees. I am working on membership/sponsorship/donor opportunity as well.

January 10, 2023 – Met with Art Show Committee via conference re juried show. Artist work being submitted. Deadline for all submissions is January 18th. Area schools have been contacted. The museum re-opened on July 1, 2021, but due to the global pandemic known as COVID-19 (and now the Delta, Omicron and more variants still being discovered), affecting almost every part of life on a global scale, and in response to the declarations from federal, state, and local officials, **the museum will accommodate tours/visitations Monday-Friday during normal hours of operation or by appointment. Masks are optional for all visitors.**

February 1- Kick Off - The 10th Annual Lenora Rolla Juried Art Show (Virtual) -online on website

February 6, 2023 – Megan Coca made presentation to Cancer Cares organization for Black History Month. I was in attendance for moral support and answered questions when necessary.

February 7, 2023 – Jayn Higgins made presentation to students in the after-school program at the Riverside Community Center. Megan Coca and I were also in attendance. Topic - Why We Celebrate Black History and Fort Worth Black History

February 9, 2023 – I made a PowerPoint presentation to the students at TCC South Campus for Black History Month – Topic - Black Resistance and What Does It Look Like in Tarrant County – approximately 25 people in attendance.

I was notified that a grant had been approved for \$10,000 by Brave/R Together/United Way! I assisted Megan with first grant application that is focused on education and the Happy Readers project that is tailored for VanZandt Guinn Elementary School, grades K-5.

Art Show Reception and Awards via Zoom – 32 participants on the call. Thanks to the board members who were present on the call. Remarks were made by sponsors, artists, Art show committee members, and our President, Jimmy Walker.

February 10, 2023 – Tara Crosby and co-worker, Dana, from KPMG LLP, visited the museum with four other employees.

Dr. Jennifer Giddings Brooks held a community meeting at the Lenora Rolla Museum – 11 people in attendance – to discuss the new organization formed to address the needs of the 76104-zip code. The organization will reside in the old Flint house on the corner of Terrell and Tennessee

February 11, 2023 – Film crew from the Dallas Mavericks that visited the museum to film segment for Black History Month featuring Mrs. Rolla and the Lenora Rolla Heritage Center Museum notified me that the segment aired during the play-by-play action during the Mavericks' basketball game. Received a follow-up link and was sent out to all Board and Advisory Board members.

February 13, 2023 – Attended Zoom call with the Jack and Jill Organization – will host program for young girls in the GEMS class on **March 4, 2023**, at the Lenora Rolla Museum and **will become an “organization” member. The program is scheduled from 10am-3pm** – tour of the museum, guest speaker, Estella Williams, NAACP, GEMS training in the library area, and a final activity – a community service project will be conducted that same day by planting flowers in the front yard of the museum.

February 15, 2023 - I made a PowerPoint presentation to the students at TCC Trinity River Campus in observance of Black History Month – Topic “Did You Know?” – Fort Wort and Tarrant County Black History

February 16, 2023 – **Required City of FW Annual Back Flow Test done** – 2 areas passed; one area failed - (bypass - Fire Alarm Sprinkler System) will cost approximately \$250-\$300) Order has been placed for the repair with ADT. (Total cost - \$360.00)

Megan Coca made a presentation re Black History Month at the Ridglea Public Library 5:00pm – Topic – Historic Black Neighborhoods

February 19, 2023 – I attended a reception presented by Brave/R Together with other grant recipients and was presented with a check in the amount of \$10,000.00, a grant, for a literacy project, headed up by Megan Coca.

February 20, 2023 - Southside Community Center students -after school program toured the Lenora Rolla Museum at 2pm. Megan Coca conducted the tour. She was assisted by Sarah Walker and Ms. Bennie Ruth Dickens.

February 22, 2023 – Megan Coca and I met with Log Cabin Village to discuss collaboration on a project entitled “Stopping Stones.” Their site was selected for this project and will acknowledge and memorialize enslaved peoples across the USA. Stopping Stones unique organization that creates small memorials that commemorate individuals who were enslaved locally. The purpose of these memorials is to help citizens realize and remember the histories of slavery and to create conversations that address racial issues today. This is an art project started by an artist in Vermont after being inspired by similar stones memorializing those lost in the Holocaust in Germany. Each hand-engraved “stone” carries the name, profession, and enslaved dates of an individual enslaved in that particular place. In our case, the two stones will bear the names of Jefferson Walton and Molly, two people enslaved by the Foster family through whose plantation-style home visitors now enter Log Cabin Village. They are and one of the first museums in the **South** to install Stopping Stones and look forward to the educational opportunities it will provide all visitors. They are interested in partnering with us on the dedication ceremony for the stones and hoping to schedule the dedication ceremony around this year’s Juneteenth celebrations the weekend before or the weekend after Juneteenth Celebration.

And, Women In Power Empowering contacted us on that same day to partner with us for Women’s History Month – theme is Celebrating Women Who Tell Our Stories.

4pm - Fortress 4th grade students - after school program-toured Lenora Rolla Museum. Megan Coca conducted the tour.

February 23, 2022 – Megan Coca attended the VanZandt-Guinn Elementary School Black History Program entitled “I Choose to Change the World. Students portrayed famous Black Americans that have made significant contributions to American History. The students also engaged in inspiring songs and recited poetry.

February 24, 2023 – Received an invitation to attend A Gathering of Museums meeting at Kinfolk House, hosted by the National Juneteenth Museum. Some of the invited guests included representatives from The Kimbell, The Modern, Amon Carter, FW African Museum & Culture, DNA Works-Transform 1012, and UNT Digitization Services Department. The guests were treated to a slide presentation by Jared Howard with an overview of the description, location, and other amenities the museum would offer not only to the residents of the Historic Southside community, but to all of FW and Tarrant County. Megan Coca and Deborah Lewis also attended the event.

February 26, 2023 – 11:30am - Tarrant County Pearls Chapter visited the Lenora Rolla Museum for an onsite photo shoot and meeting – 12 visitors were in attendance. An overview of our organization was presented by Brenda Sanders-Wise before their meeting began and a tour was conducted afterwards.

February 27, 2022 – 1pm – Fort Worth Magazine interview and photo shoot at the Lenora Rolla Museum for Mike Guinn, Spoken Word artist. Mike acts as emcee and hosts the Spoken Word Contest for the TCBHGS – annual Tarrant County Harambee Festival.
