CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

COUNTY OF TARRANT

BACKGROUND

This Contract for Services is between Tarrant County, Texas ("COUNTY") and Jessica Batts, Psy. D., LCDC, Professional Services ("PROVIDER") for the provision of first offender education services to the participants of the Tarrant County First Offender Drug Program. The Commissioners Court finds that this contract serves a public purpose in protecting the public welfare of the citizens of Tarrant County, Texas.

CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

PROVIDER will provide certain mental health services for participants of the Tarrant County First Offenders Drug Program as specified by the program manager. The Provider agrees to provide the following services:

- 1.1 Substance Abuse Education Classes
- 1.2 Written certificates of completion for each participant assigned to treatment; and
- 1.3 Access to applicable records upon 30 days written notice while maintaining legally required confidentiality of medical and mental health information.

2. TERM

This contract begins on November 1, 2022 and concludes on September 30, 2023.

3. COST

The COUNTY will pay no more than \$75.00 for a 6 hour Drug Education Class. During the term of this contract, COUNTY will pay no more than \$10,000.00 the total budgeted by Tarrant County for Jessica Batts, Psy. D., LCDC. COUNTY will pay PROVIDER within 30 days of invoice receipt when the PROVIDER satisfies the following conditions:

- 3.1 PROVIDER will bill for services performed in accord with this contract;
- 3.2 PROVIDER will send a monthly invoice to Tarrant County Criminal Courts Administration Office, 401 W. Belknap, 6th Floor, Fort Worth, Texas 76196;
- 3.3 PROVIDER'S invoice will detail the number of sessions provided and the rate

4. FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

PROVIDER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ITS INCURRED EXPENSES IN PERFORMING THIS CONTRACT.

5. INDEMNIFICATION

TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY THE CONSTITUTION AND THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, VENDOR AGREES TO indemnify, save, and hold harmless the COUNTY from all costs or damages arising out of VENDOR's negligence or out of any real or asserted claim or cause of action

against it of whatsoever kind or character and in addition, from any and all costs or damages arising out of any wrongs, injuries, demands or suits for damages, either real or asserted, claimed against it that may be occasioned by VENDOR's negligence or any act, omission, neglect or misconduct of the said VENDOR, its agents, servants, and employees.

6. AGENCY-INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

PROVIDER is an independent contractor. COUNTY will not direct the PROVIDER in the details of performing its duties. PROVIDER and its employees are not agents of the COUNTY. COUNTY and its employees are not agents of PROVIDER. This contract does not entitle PROVIDER to any benefit, privilege or other amenities of employment with the COUNTY. This contract does not entitle COUNTY to any benefit, privilege or other amenities of employment with the PROVIDER.

7. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party may assign this contract without prior written consent of the other party.

8. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY EXCLUDED

This contract does not protect any specific third party. The intent of this contract excludes the idea of a suit by a third party beneficiary. The parties to this contract do not consent to the waiver of sovereign immunity under Texas law to the extent either party may have that immunity under Texas law.

9. MISCELLANEOUS

This contract supersedes all prior representations. The parties may amend this contract by subsequent written amendments. The parties will not amend this contract orally. The law of the State of Texas governs this contract. Venue for any action regarding this contract must be in the district courts of Tarrant County, Texas.

10. TERMINATION

Either party may terminate this contract without cause by:

- 10.1 Providing written notice to the other party at least 30 days prior to the date of termination;
- 10.2 Providing in the written notice the date of termination; and
- 10.3 Sending the written notice by certified mail return receipt requested to the party at its address.

11. CHOICE OF LAW AND VENUE

This contract will be governed by the laws of the State of Texas without giving effect to conflict of law provisions or principles. Venue for any litigation related to or arising from this contract will be in the state or federal district courts located in Fort Worth, Texas.

12. VERIFICATION

VENDOR verifies that it does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of this contract. The term "boycott Israel" is defined by Texas Government Code Section 808.001, effective September 1, 2017. VENDOR further verifies that it is not engaged in business with Iran, Sudan, or any foreign terrorist organization. The term "foreign terrorist organization" means an organization designated as a foreign terrorist organization by the United States Secretary of State as authorized by 8 U.S.C. Section 1189.

13. FORM 1295 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Provider acknowledges and agrees that in accordance with Section 2252.908 (b) – (c) of the Texas Government Code, it has fully, accurately, and completely disclosed all interested parties on the Texas Ethics Commission's Form 1295 attached and marked "Attachment A."

Vendor is EXEMPT from Certification regarding Energy Companies and Firearm Entities or Firearm Trade Associations:

Vendor is a sole proprietorship OR is a non-profit entity OR Vendor is a company that does NOT have 10 or more full-time employees AND/OR this contract does NOT have a value of \$ 100,000.00 or more that is to be paid wholly or partly from public funds of the governmental entity.

Vendor is NOT EXEMPT and Certifies as follows:

Boycott of Energy Companies Prohibited. "Discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association" is defined in Section 2274.001(3) (added by 87th Legislature, S.B. 19) and means, with respect to the entity or association, to: (i) refuse to engage in the trade of any goods or services with the entity or association based solely on its status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association; (ii) refrain from continuing an existing business relationship with the entity or association based solely on its status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association; or (iii) terminate an existing business relationship with the entity or association based solely on its status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association; the term *does not include*: (i) the established policies of a merchant, retail seller, or platform that restrict or prohibit the listing or selling of ammunition, firearms, or firearm accessories; and (ii) a company's refusal to engage in the trade of any goods or services, decision to refrain from continuing an existing business

relationship, or decision to terminate an existing business relationship: (aa) to comply with federal, state, or local law, policy, or regulations or a directive by a regulatory agency; or (bb) for any traditional business reason that is specific to the customer or potential customer and not based solely on an entity's or association's status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association.
