

**FIRST AMENDMENT TO TISSUE RECOVERY AND FACILITIES USE AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN TARRANT COUNTY AND TARRANT EYE RESOURCES, Inc. D/B/A  
FORT WORTH EYE AND TISSUE BANK**

This First Amendment to the Tissue Recovery and Facilities Use Agreement ("Amendment") between Tarrant County, Texas ("County"), a political subdivision of the State of Texas and Tarrant Eye Resources, Inc. d/b/a Fort Worth Eye and Tissue Bank ("Contractor"), a non-profit corporation. This Amendment shall be effective once fully executed.

**RECITALS**

WHEREAS, County and Contractor entered into a Tissue Recovery and Facilities Use Agreement ("Agreement") on November 16, 2021, as reflected in Commissioners Court Order Number 136838,

WHEREAS, the County will continue to allow access to cadavers in its custody to experienced tissue procurement organizations, so as to ensure security to its facility, integrity to its cases, and efficiency in the operation of its duties; and


NOW THEREFORE, County and Fort Worth Eye and Tissue Bank agree as follows:

1. Paragraph Seven of the Agreement is modified to change and extend the term from the original termination date of November 16, 2022, to the new termination date of November 16, 2023. Unless the parties explicitly agree to not renew the agreement prior to November 16, 2023, the agreement will renew automatically for one additional year to November 16, 2024 without additional action from the parties.
2. Except as amended herein, the Agreement is unchanged.
