AMENDMENT NO. 1
SUBRECIPIENT CONTRACT

This Amendment No. 1 to the Subrecipient Contract is made and entered into by and between Tarrant County, Texas ("COUNTY"), on behalf of Tarrant County Public Health ("TCPH"), and The Fatherhood Coalition of Tarrant County ("SUBRECIPIENT").

WHEREAS, a Subrecipient Contract, approved by the Tarrant County Commissioners Court, on November 8, 2022 through Court Order #139647, approved \$368,830.00 in funding to the SUBRECIPIENT;

WHEREAS, Section 13.B Terms and Conditions of Payment states that Tarrant County may provide advance payment of a portion of the award amount as startup funding in advance;

WHEREAS, SUBRECIPIENT has, formally requested advanced payment startup funding in the amount of \$36,810.56 which would leave a balance of \$332,019.44 in funding remaining,

WHEREAS, SUBRECIPIENT has stated that these advanced payment startup funds will be used to cover expenses required for start-up activities. Funds will also be used to purchase office supplies and computer equipment;

WHEREAS, the Tarrant County Public Health Department has deemed this an approvable request;

WHEREAS SUBRECIPIENT shall ensure that Reporting Requirements for all expenditures are met as prescribed Section 12 of the Subrecipient Contract; and

NOW AND THEREFORE the requested advanced payment startup funding shall be processed and paid from the previously approved \$368,830.00 budget amount.
