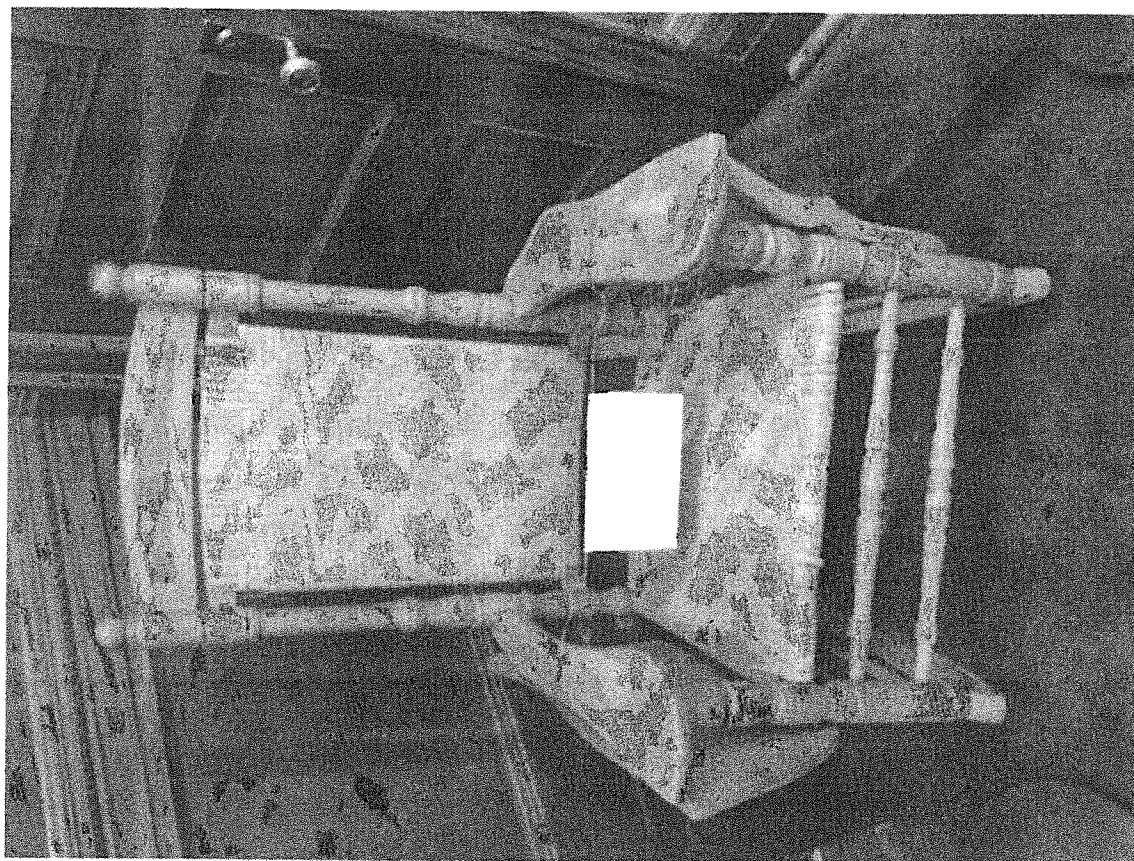

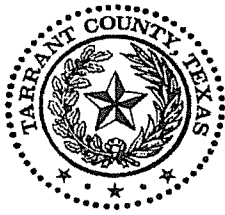

**Summary:** One large extendable wooden table carved with lion reliefs on corners and legs, two table slats, and four grey wooden chairs with two lion head reliefs on top of each. Two of the chairs suffered damage, with one missing a lion head relief and the other a wood support.

According to Bill Hudson, the table belonged to the son of John Peter Smith and his wife Josephine Terrell Smith Hudson, who lived at 4736 Crestline Road in Fort Worth. It remained there from 1957-2002 and was used only for holidays and big occasions. After Josephine's death, her son Bill Hudson took ownership of the table and moved it to 616 Cherry Street, Fort Worth, then an office for his oil business. He then gave it to his daughter and her husband when they moved to Cambridge, Massachusetts. In 2020, they expressed a willingness to donate the table, which was delivered to the archives on September 23, 2021.
