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In compliance with Senate Bill 1074 of the 77<sup>th</sup> Legislature, the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office is providing the data collected regarding stops, contacts, and searches during the calendar year 2022. Attached are the following documents:

- Racial profiling data with charts on the number of contacts by race, contacts by violation, searches by race and final outcomes by race;
- A copy of the Tarrant County Racial Profiling Policy approved by the Commissioners' Court; and
- A copy of the Tarrant County Sheriff's web-site that outlines the process to file complaints about racial profiling, including another copy of the policy.

In 2022, the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office recorded a total of 10,326 traffic stops within the racial profiling reporting system. This number reflects a significant increase of traffic stops over the 2021 total of 5,503. Hazardous violations comprised 5,246 (51%) of the total stops, and the non-hazardous percentage were the remaining 49%.

Contacts by race as a percentage of total stops are: stops of white drivers totaled 56% of all stops in 2022, a decrease of 5% from 2021. Hispanic drivers had a slight increase of 1% from 2021. African American drivers experienced an increase of 2.5 % of total stops from 2021. Stops of Asian drivers increased slightly from 1.2% to 1.8% of all violator stops. Stops of Middle Eastern and Native American drivers were so few that their ratios are statistically small, at 0.9%. The yearly variance in the contact data, i.e., contacts by


race as a percentage of total stops, are most likely reflective of the changing demographics of the driving population within the county.

Deputies were able to discern the driver characteristics prior to the stop at the ratio of 3.5% of stops (364 of 10,326). Deputies recognized the violator before the stop on 37 occasions, less than 1% of the total stops. Recognizing the violator prior to the stop is indicative of the driver being known to the deputy from previous contacts.

Enforcement action in 2022 occurred in 12% of contacts (1237), which is a decrease from the 2021 enforcement of 16%. White drivers received 46% of enforcement action in 2022, a decrease of 2% from 2021. The African American driver enforcement action resulted in 26% of the total, a percentage increase of 2% from 2021. Hispanic drivers receiving enforcement action made up 25.3% of the total, resulting in no statistical increase over 2021. Asian drivers consisted of 1.4% of overall enforcement. Middle Eastern and Native American enforcement ratios combined were 0.4%.

Deputies conducted 567 vehicle searches in 2022 (5.5% of all stops), which reflects a decrease of 0.6% compared to 2021. Deputies conduct vehicle searches when they develop probable cause to believe contraband is present, upon plain view of contraband, when the search is incident to an arrest, or after arrest and during the inventory of the vehicle prior to towing. Those searches accounted for 414 of the total searches (73%). The remaining 153 were incidents where the driver provided consent to the deputy to conduct a search. Deputies located contraband in 280 searches, with the most common items of contraband seized being drugs (236 seizures), alcohol (25 seizures) and weapons (8 seizures). In 2022 deputies made 232 arrests out of 10,326 total stops (2.2%). A total of 1,005 citations were issued, a 36% increase over 2021.

The Tarrant County Sheriff's Office did not receive any complaints of racial profiling in 2022. The Sheriff's Office monitors the activities of deputies by monitoring and observing the actions of deputies regarding racial profiling, including reviews of traffic stop videos, and reviews of reporting standards and compliance. The department's policy prohibiting racial profiling and the procedures for filing a complaint of racial profiling can be found on the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office public access web site, <http://access.tarrantcounty.com/en/sheriff.html> under the Administration tab, or the inquire tab.

TARRANT COUNTY RACIAL PROFILING POLICY

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1074 was recently passed by the Legislature of the State of Texas prohibiting a peace officer from engaging in racial profiling;

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1074 requires that not later than January 1st, 2002, a law enforcement agency covered by the law must adopt and implement a policy and begin collecting information under the policy;

WHEREAS, the Tarrant County Sheriff and the Constables of Tarrant County are now adopting, before the Tarrant County Commissioners Court, a policy prohibiting racial profiling by their agencies;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Tarrant County Sheriff and the Constables of Tarrant County (hereinafter collectively referred to as "agencies") adopt the following policy:

**Section 1.**

Racial profiling is defined as any law enforcement-initiated action based on an individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin rather than on the individual's behavior or on information identifying the individual as having engaged in criminal activity.

**Section 2.**

All peace officers employed by the agencies are strictly prohibited from engaging in racial profiling. All law enforcement-initiated actions, which include all investigative detentions, traffic stops, arrests, searches and seizures of persons and/or property shall be based on a standard of reasonable suspicion or probable cause as required by law. All peace officers of the agencies must be able to articulate specific facts, circumstances and conclusions, which support probable cause or reasonable suspicion for the investigative detention, traffic stop or arrest.

**Section 3.**

All peace officers employed by the agencies shall not consider an individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin in establishing either reasonable suspicion, probable cause or as a basis for requesting consent to search the individual or his or her property.

**Section 4.**

All peace officers employed by the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office must "check out" via radio on every vehicle or subject stop. At the conclusion of each stop, the peace officer will complete either a computerized or written form, capturing all data elements required to be obtained by law. This information will then be uploaded from the MDC to a computer database (if a computerized form) or manually inputted into a computer database (if a written form).

**Section 5.**

No peace officer employed by the agencies will conduct a search of a person or vehicle after peace officer-initiated contact without completing a written report detailing the search and the facts supporting it. In the event no offense or arrest report is appropriate, a Miscellaneous Incident report will be completed.

**Section 6.**

If an individual believes that a peace officer employed by any of the agencies has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual then the following complaint process shall govern:

A. Sheriff: If an individual believes that a peace officer employed by the Sheriff's Office has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual then the individual must file a written complaint before the 180th day after the alleged violation with the Tarrant County Sheriff's Department Internal Affairs Division located at 200 Taylor Street, Fort Worth, Texas 76102.

B. Constable: Refer to Constable Contact Page

**Section 7.**

The agencies will provide public education relating to the agencies complaint process via the Tarrant County web site located at www.tarrantcounty.com.

**Section 8.**

Appropriate corrective action will be taken against a peace officer employed by the agencies who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of this policy.

**Section 9.**

The agencies will collect information as required by law relating to traffic stops in which a citation is issued and to arrests resulting from those traffic stops, including information relating to:

A. The race or ethnicity of the individual detained; and

B. Whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the person detained consented to the search.

**Section 10.**

Each agency will submit to the Tarrant County Commissioners Court an annual report of the information collected pursuant to Section 9 above. Each agency shall first submit information to the Tarrant County Commissioners Court on March 1, each year. The first submission of information shall consist of information compiled by each agency during the period beginning January 1, each year, and ending December 31, each year. The report may not include identifying information about a peace officer who makes a traffic stop or about an individual who is stopped or arrested by a peace officer.


You may contact the Internal Affairs Division referencing the apparent misconduct by a Tarrant County Sheriff's Department employee in person, or by calling 817-884-1108. Office hours are Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., (excluding County holidays). After office hours, a message and return phone number may be left via voice mail and the call will be returned the following business day.

The Internal Affairs Division will investigate any calls that appear to be Level III. The result of these investigations may result in severe disciplinary action, up to loss of employment, or possible criminal investigation. Because of the severe consequences of sustained Third Level Complaints you must come to the Sheriff's Office to complete and sign a formal complaint form. If you are unable to come to the Sheriff's Office, accommodations will be made.

The complaint process generally takes the Department 60 calendar days to complete the investigation and for the Board of Disciplinary Review to determine what discipline shall be recommended and/or imposed.






The above listed license data was obtained by the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office in January 2021 and January 2023. Starting in 2020, DPS stop tracking "Hispanic" as a separate category and put this information in the "Other" category. Per DPS in January 2022, they would not provide any drivers' license data at that time. Data from 2020 was used for the 2021 Racial Profiling report submitted in February 2022.

The Tarrant County Sheriff's Office started tracking data on "Indian" or "Native American" and "Middle Eastern" in 2010. Since the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office does not keep data on "Other", the 9.8% for "Other" was placed in the "White" category which makes it 73.5% "White" for 2022.

The above License data was obtained by the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office in January 2021 and January 2023. The license data is all license data tracked by the Texas Department of Public Safety. In January 2022, DPS stated that they would not release any drivers' license data at this time.

Since TCSO does not keep data on "Other", the "Other" was placed in the "White" category which makes it 74.8% total "White" in 2020 and 73.5% total "White" in 2022. TCSO was informed that DPS stopped tracking "Hispanic" as a race and included this information in "White" or "Other" categories. No "Hispanic" data was provided by DPS to TCSO.

\*\*The Texas Department of Public Safety started in 2011 tracking "Hispanic" in a separate category, only a small number of "Hispanics" have renewed or received a license since the change was made. As a result, only starting in 2016 was there significant number of "Hispanics" listed in the data from the Texas Department of Public Safety to create a separate category for this report. However, DPS informed TCISO in January 2021 that they no longer track "Hispanic" as a separate race category, but as an "Ethnic" group. As a result, "Hispanic" was now placed in the "Other" category.

License information from 2010 includes "Hispanic" and "Pacific islander" in the "White" category. "Pacific Islander" is now included in the "Asian" category.

\*\*\*The Texas Department of Public Safety compiled and provided the above race data by zip code only and not for Tarrant County. only in these years. This caused the number of licensed drivers to be elevated in these years because it included a number of licensed drivers from zip codes that crossed Tarrant County lines into adjacent counties. In the years 2010, 2011 and 2012 to present, the Texas Department of Public Safety provided race data for the entire Tarrant County.
