

**Amendment No. 1**  
**Tarrant County Contract #RFP NO. 2022-123 Contract for VEMACS Software and Services**  
**Between VOTEC Corporation ( "VENDOR" ) and Tarrant County ( "COUNTY" )**

Tarrant County Contract # RFP NO. 2022-123 Contract for VEMACS Software and Services is modified as follows:


1. In the section following "Witnesseth" and just following the paragraph "The following VOTEC generated documents are to be signed by both parties and incorporated into this contract by reference:", strike "2. VOTEC Oracle Sublicense Agreement".
2. In Section I – VOTEC Agrees. following the 7<sup>th</sup> and last bullet, add the following:
  8. Provide and administer a hosted environment for all VEMACS functionality in the Oracle Gov Cloud.
  9. This environment will include Gov Cloud level security which may be redefined by Oracle from time to time.
  10. In the event the primary server becomes unavailable, users will be connected to an alternate data center where a standby server is already synchronized with the primary server. Potential data loss is none to a few minutes. Lost productivity is none to less than 15 minutes.
3. In Section II – COUNTY Agrees in subsection 1, strike the line item "OCR Development, License, and Installation" and its associated cost of "\$50,000.00". Adjust the Total just below in which this cost was included to read "\$83,250.00".
4. In Section II – COUNTY Agrees in subsection 2, strike the line item "Database Appliance" across all columns and replace with "Oracle Gov Cloud Hosting plus Management Services" at the identical cost. The totals at the bottom of the three columns remain unchanged.
5. In Section II – COUNTY Agrees Immediately following the annual support cost itemization are nine bullets that complete this section. Replace those nine bullets with the following five bullets:
  1. To approve computer access for VOTEC employees assigned under this agreement.
  2. To appoint a COUNTY project manager to work with VOTEC throughout Term of contract.
  3. To dedicate appropriate COUNTY personnel to the specification, installation, testing, training, and operation of the licensed software.
  4. To adhere to the VOTEC Corporation Software License Agreement.
  5. To review all data conversion reports and correct, or provide direction to VOTEC as to how to handle any inconsistencies or apparent errors in the data.
6. In Section III – BOTH PARTIES AGREE under subsection 3, remove bullet "a. All hardware and all software provided by the COUNTY for connecting the Oracle Appliance server will be installed and tested before VOTEC installs VOTEC provided software. VOTEC will provide remote support if necessary."
7. In Section IV – Following the paragraph "Performance hereunder shall be construed and regulated in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas." Insert the following paragraph: "Compliance with Laws. In providing the services required by this Agreement, VOTEC must observe and comply with all applicable federal, state, and local statutes, ordinances, rules, and

*regulations, including, without limitation, workers' compensation laws, minimum and maximum salary and wage statutes and regulations, and non-discrimination laws and regulations. VOTEC shall be responsible for ensuring its compliance with any laws and regulations applicable to its business, including maintaining any necessary licenses and permits."*

This Amendment takes effect upon signature by all parties.
