ADDENDUM NUMBER ONE TO
MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Amendment Number One to the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between Tarrant County and the Arlington Housing Authority is for the term extension of one (1) year.

BACKGROUND

On October 18, 2022, the Commissioner's Court, through Court Order #139471, approved a Memorandum of Agreement with Arlington Housing Authority which allows the Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) Program to work in a collaborative effort with the Arlington Housing Authority Continuum of Care (CoC) Rapid Re-Housing Arlington Nurse Family Partnership (ANFP) Program to provide housing for qualified NFP clients. The term of MOA ends October 17, 2023 and includes an option of three (3) additional twelve (12) month renewal periods.

With the permission of the Tarrant County Commissioners Court the first option will be exercised, extending the term through October 17, 2024.

All other terms and conditions not hereby amended shall remain in full force and effect.
