COMMISSIONERS COURT ACTION REQUESTED

It is requested that the Commissioners Court approve the use of the Family Law Center and Tom Vandergriff Civil Courts Building for the 2023 National Trial Competition beginning Thursday, February 9, 2023 and ending Saturday, February 11, 2023.

BACKGROUND

On January 21, 2020, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order No. 131964, approved the use of the Family Law Center and Tom Vandergriff Civil Courts Building for the 2020 National Trial Competition when it was held in Fort Worth.

On March 8, 2022, the Commissioners Court, through Court Order No. 137654, approved the use of the Family Law Center and Tom Vandergriff Civil Courts Building for the 2022 National Trial Competition when it was held in Fort Worth

The 2023 National Mock Trial Competition is scheduled to be held in Fort Worth on February 9, 2023 through February 11, 2023. Judge Don Cosby is assisting the Texas A&M School of Law along with Texas Young Lawyers of the State Bar of Texas with the event and has requested the use of the Family Law Center and Tom Vandergriff Civil Courts Building for the upcoming competition. This includes courtrooms, assembly rooms, the Lawyers Lounge and the Vandergriff Jury Room.

The County Jury Administrator, Family and Civil District Court Judges have no opposition with this event.

The Sheriff's Office has agreed to provide security during the non-business hours of this competition.

FISCAL IMPACT
