Resolution Honoring Fire Marshal Randy Renois

WHEREAS, Tarrant County Fire Marshal Randy Renois began his career with Tarrant County as Deputy Fire Marshal in 1991 and was named County Fire Marshal in 1998; and

WHEREAS, after proudly representing Tarrant County for more than 26 years as Fire Marshal, Renois will be retiring on May 31, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Renois has worked closely with the Texas A&M Forest Service and the Texas Intrastate Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) during wildfire seasons and established five wildfire strike teams from Tarrant County fire departments to respond to wildfires across our state and surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, Renois established and helped operate hurricane shelters as well as coordinate local responders' efforts to hurricanes Katrina, Rita, Ike and Harvey; and also served as grant coordinator from 1999-2006 for Federal and State Homeland Security grants to provide approximately \$4 million in equipment and training for fire departments across Tarrant County; and

WHEREAS, Renois served on the Texas Department of Emergency Management committee establishing a statewide mutual aid system for responses to all hazards incidents and helped establish the Tarrant County mutual aid assistance agreements for fire, EMS and explosion investigations; and

WHEREAS, Renois was Tarrant County's representative on the North Texas Council of Government's Regional Emergency Preparedness Council (REPAC), appointed by the Governor to the First Responders Advisory Council and served on the State Fire Marshals' Fireworks Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, Renois has been a fire instructor for 15 years at the Annual TEEX Firefighter School in College Station as well a fire instructor at Weatherford College and Tarrant County College.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Commissioners Court of Tarrant County, do hereby recognize Fire Marshal Randy Renois on his exemplary service to Tarrant County and congratulate him on his retirement.
